SUBJECT: 2022 Legislative Session – Week 3 (January 24-28)

With week three of the 2022 legislative session in the rear view mirror, the Legislature is now one-third of the way through the nine week session. The Capitol was bustling this week as we saw some notable bills gained momentum and continued through committees in the legislative process, as well as the confirmation hearing of the State Surgeon General Joseph Ladapo, the progression of the House legislative redistricting maps, and new public record exemptions. These and other topics are covered in our summary of the week in Tallahassee.

NAIOP Activities

The GR team met with House Commerce Chair Blaise Ingoglia to advocate on building inspection legislation, EV charging station regulations, and building permit reform. The Chair is working on all three and will be updating us as the week continue.

As well, the team has been working on attendees to NAIOP Days at the Capitol. If you have not already please sign up so we have an accurate head count. The dates are the afternoon of February 15 and the morning of February 16.

Notable Topics

Minimum Wage

Last year, Senate President Wilton Simpson urged an increase to the minimum wage for state workers to \$13 an hour. This year, Simpson is once again pushing for a minimum wage increase, but instead to \$15 an hour. The increase would cost the State \$1 billion, but Simpson argues “We have the cash this year to do it, so there’s no excuse.” In 2020, an amendment passed that would raise the minimum wage to \$15 an hour by 2026, under Simpson’s plan this would speed up the process by 4 years. Several state agencies are struggling to retain and recruit workers, this could alleviate the high turnover rate, says Simpson. Along with this measure, HB 943 prevents cities and counties from requiring high minimum wages for their own employees moves forward. Despite facing opposition, the bill passed with a 10-7 vote while the Senate version (SB 1124) failed to get a vote in after running out of time during debate.

COVID-19 Treatments

The topic of COVID-19 treatments rises again after President Biden withdrew monoclonal antibody therapies. Governor DeSantis was forced to close the five state monoclonal antibody administration sites last week. The FDA stated that the two monoclonal treatments were not effective against the Omicron variant. DeSantis condemns Biden for this decision stating there was no clinical data to support this move and demands Biden’s administration to reverse the withdrawal.

“The Star-Spangled Banner”

Under HB 499, any sport team in contract with state or local government will be required to play the national anthem before every game. It would also allow the Attorney General to enforce this provision. Representative Gregory, the bill sponsor of the House version, states this as a “small ask” of the franchises. Criticisms come from Democratic legislators stating it as an issue of contract law rather than that of the First Amendment. In a rare move, Rep. Joseph filed a handwritten amendment against the bill; it would offer an opt out for franchises who wish to engage in protest. However, it was unsuccessful. On the Senate side, Sen. Gruters, the bill sponsor, said this was “a proactive approach to make sure people play it.” This measure cleared its first committees in both House and Senate.

House Legislative Map

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House map (H 8013) was advanced in committee. The map defines the 120 House districts. While Rep. Omphroy crossed party lines to vote yes, other Democrats criticized the map of not having enough public involvement and not accounting for the growth in minority populations – concerns from previous committee meetings. In response, Latino Justice mentioned that the Latino population in Florida grew from 22% in the 2010 Census to more than 26%. The growing Haitian American population was of concern to Rep. Driskell, reminding the Legislature that protecting language minorities is a constitutional requirement for maps. Representative Leek, Chair of the House Redistricting Committee, stated that that map was worked on for months and the product produced is constitutionally compliant. This draft could potentially have 19 House members who seek another term in competition with one another. The map will soon hit the House floor.

Confirmation Hearing

In the Senate Health Policy Committee, State Surgeon General Joseph Ladapo's confirmation was met with frustration from Democratic Senators. Ladapo was appointed by Gov. DeSantis in replacement of Scott Rivkees, the previous state surgeon general. Democratic Leader Sen. Book repeatedly asked Ladapo questions on the effectiveness of vaccines and masks, but he did not give a "yes or no" answer to Book's liking, rather responding that he is "married to data" and reiterated his answer that the vaccines have "reasonable effectiveness" against hospitalization and death. Book also mentioned the interaction he had with Sen. Polsky back in October. Ladapo met with Polsky where he refused to wear a mask after she stated she had a serious medical condition, which was later revealed as breast cancer. After criticism from the Democrats, Sen. Book led a walk out and abstained from voting. The rest of the members voted in favor of the confirmation for Surgeon General and head of the Florida Department of Health. Senate President Wilton Simpson and DeSantis believe it will move on in the process when it hits the Senate floor.

Progress Monitoring

One of Governor DeSantis' priority bills, SB 1048 by Sen. Diaz, passed unanimously in the Senate Education Appropriations Subcommittee. This measure replaces the current standardized testing (FSA) with a progress monitoring program. This includes computer-based screening with three assessments throughout the year. Diaz says, "the goal is to devote less time on testing and more time on learning." The costs attached to this change are still unknown but will be discussed in its final committee stop (Appropriations).

Public Records Exemption

Senate Bill 520 by Sen. Brandes passed its last committee stop (Rules) in a 12-5 vote. This bill would create a public records exemption for information about applicants pursuing a state university or college presidential position. After the finalists have been chosen, the public will have 21 days to view their information. This is not the first time the Senate has heard this proposal; this is the 8th session in which the bill has appeared. In 2021, the House version passed but it did not clear the Senate. Similar to previous years, this bill faces opposition regarding the public's right to government, although the proponents of the bill state it is necessary in order to attract the

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most qualified candidates out there, so that the applicants identities are protected in the initial phases of the process. The House has filed its version (HB 703) by Rep. Garrison that awaits its first hearing. This bill is ready to be heard on the Senate floor but requires a two-thirds vote of each chamber to become law, as it deals with public records.

Emergency Lockdowns

Legislation that protects churches from emergency lockdowns (SB 254) passed in the Senate by a 31-3 vote with Senators Berman, Polsky, and Powell voting against. Questions arose of the bill sponsor, Sen. Brodeur, regarding constraints that the bill places on state and local government emergency orders. The House version, HB 215, by Rep. DiCeglie faced more opposition from Democrats yet he is considering making changes to define what constitutes a regular religious activity/service.
