SUBJECT: 2022 Legislative Session – Committee Week 6 (November 29- December 3)

The last committee week was, as expected, busy – both in the Capitol and out on Adams Street. The full menu of House and Senate committees met and many pieces of legislation began moving. As well, given the November Special Session prohibited legislators from fundraising, Adams Street was bustling with fundraisers and quick meetings to allow for the members to keep pace on their fundraising goals. Amidst all of that, the redistricting process continued, the Seminole Tribe was dealt a bad hand in Federal court, and the legislators began implementation of the 2018 constitutional ban on lobbying within six years of legislative service. While the rest of December will be relatively quiet, make no mistake, the legislative wheels will be turning in anticipation of the January 11th start to the 2022 Legislative Session. All of that and more are detailed below.

NAIOP Activities

The GR team held its monthly zoom meeting with NAIOP representatives on Friday. During this week, your GR team worked closely with the legislature on issues related to fire code, EV charging stations and the Florida Building Commission. As the white papers are finalized, our team will refine its efforts.

Notable Topics

Transportation Train

The 2022 legislative session's first train has left the station. A transportation bill, SB398, filed by state Sen. Ed Hooper (R-Clearwater) quickly passed its first committee stop Wednesday, but not before open acknowledgment that it's a prime target to be loaded up with amendments throughout the 2022 legislative session, a process that will make the bill what's informally dubbed a "bill train." Among the things the bill presently proposes, it would revise the minimum

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of 15% deposited into the State Transportation Trust Fund be used for roads in ports, public transit and create a maximum of 25%. As well, the bill would authorize FDOT to engage in progressive design-build contracts, which evaluates RFPs based on qualifications of proposers and then "progresses" towards a design and contract price in collaborate with the full team.

Legislative Lobbying Ban

Florida lawmakers finally began working on the constitutionally-required 6-year lobbying ban. Florida law currently bans public officials from lobbying organizations or entities they represent for two years, but in 2018 voters passed a constitutional amendment to expand it to six years. The proposal is not set to take effect until Dec. 31, 2022, and as a result lawmakers have not approved needed implementing language. The state House Public Integrity and Ethics Committee on Tuesday without discussion passed two bills it crafted that would implement the expanded lobbying ban: one for a broad range of public officials including state lawmakers, and another that would extend the expansion to judges.

School Board Races Go Partisan?

The Florida Senate's elections panel on Tuesday backed a proposed constitutional amendment that would ask voters to decide whether or not local school board races should be partisan affairs. State Republicans support the measure, claiming that declaring party affiliation will increase transparency for school board elections amid months of tensions wrought by the Covid-19 pandemic. But Democrats voted against the proposal, arguing that it could put more pressure on school leaders and disenfranchise independent voters. Lawmakers advanced it on a 5-4 vote.

House Redistricting Maps Come Under Fire

Democrats and Republicans in Florida had reached an uneasy truce over redistricting, avoiding a major public conflict even weeks after the GOP-led state Senate had released its preliminary maps. That ended Monday. Democrats teed off on new draft congressional maps published by the Republican-led Florida House, accusing the opposing party of playing political games with the redistricting process. The public friction comes after the Republican-led state Senate earlier this month released maps that gave the GOP an additional congressional seat, but faced more criticism from Republicans than Democrats because it was seen as not aggressive enough.

The two new House maps drew an "F" grade from RepresentUS, an outside group analyzing redistricting efforts with the Princeton Gerrymandering Project. The organization has given failing grades to maps drawn in both Democratic and Republican controlled states. "In contrast to the approach taken by their counterparts in the Florida Senate, the Florida House maps clearly will not pass constitutional muster," said Joe Kabourek, senior campaign director with RepresentUS.

Seminole Gaming Deal in Trouble

The fate of Gov. Ron DeSantis' gambling deal with the Seminole Tribe of Florida remains in doubt after a federal appeals court late Friday rejected an emergency request by the Tribe to block a ruling that scrapped the \$2.5 billion agreement. The appeals court in Washington — in a 2-1 vote — refused the Tribe's request to place a stay on the decision issued late last month by U.S. District Judge Dabney Friedrich while it pursued an appeal.

The one-page decision by the U.S. Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia did not delve into why the court rejected the Tribe's request other than to state that the "appellant has not satisfied the stringent requirements for a stay pending appeal." It was noted that one of the three judges reviewing the case — Judith Rogers — would have granted the stay.

In a statement out Saturday, Seminole spokesperson Gary Bitner said the Tribe will temporarily suspend its sports betting app and players will be refunded upon request. "Despite the decision, the Seminole Tribe looks forward to working with the State of Florida and the U.S. Department of Justice to aggressively defend the validity of the 2021 Compact before the Appeals Court, which has yet to rule on the merits of the 2021 Compact," Bitner said in the statement. The Seminole Tribe of Florida, the State of Florida and the United States have all taken the position that the 2021 Compact is legal.
