SUBJECT: 2023 Legislative Session – Week 4 Summary (March 27-31)

Session is nearing the mid-way point. With Week 4 in the books, the House and Senate have officially released their proposed budgets (HB 5001 and SB 2500). Next week, they will each take up their respective spending plans and pass them. While the focus was on the money, major policy issues crossed the finish line, including Senate President Passidomo's housing legislation and House priority permitless carry. With next week being a short week, mostly focused on the budget, the legislators have the end in mind.

These and other highlights are featured below in our summary of the week that was in Tallahassee.

## **NAIOP Activities**

**Business Rent Tax** – We are expecting the tax package to come out the week of April 10 and we are bullish on the BRT reduction being included.

**Bidirectional Antennas** – There are two bills in play on this issue. The first bill is HB 89 (Maggard) and SB 512 (Hooper). This is a Building Construction bill that deals with fire issues. Senator Hooper has expressed interest in supporting an extension of the current requirement for antennas.

The other bill is SB 1614 (Rodriguez) and HB 1575 (Brackett). This would require that before a local authority having jurisdiction may require an assessment of the need for or the installation of a two-way radio communications enhancement system in a new or existing building, a qualified third party must certify that the jurisdiction's public safety emergency communications system meets or exceeds the minimum radio coverage design criteria for emergency services communications systems in the current edition of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 1221: Standard for the Installation, Maintenance, and Use of Emergency Services Communications Systems. Such certification is valid until the next triennial adoption of the Florida Fire Prevention Code which incorporates any changes made to NFPA 1221.

Further, if a jurisdiction has a valid radio coverage design certification under paragraph (c), the local authority having jurisdiction may only require an assessment of a new or existing building's interior radio coverage and signal strength in such building once every 3 years for high-rise buildings or once every 5 years for any other buildings in order to determine the need for a two-way radio communications enhancement system.

Finally, if an assessment of a new building's interior radio coverage and signal strength determines that installation of a two-way radio communications enhancement system is required, the local authority having jurisdiction may not withhold the issuance of a certificate of occupancy for the building if the registered architect or professional engineer who designed the building determines, in his or her professional judgment,

that a two-way radio communications enhancement system is not necessary in order for the building to meet the minimum standards for interior radio coverage and signal strength. The local authority having jurisdiction may not require the installation of a two-way radio communications enhancement system until at least 90 days after the building's interior radio coverage and signal strength assessment report is completed.

SB 1614 is on the committee agenda of Banking and Insurance on Wednesday, April 5. The House Bill 1575 passed the Local Administration Subcommittee on Wednesday. It is now headed to Commerce Committee.

**Florida Building Commission** – We are working with sponsors of construction and DBPR-related legislation to potentially amend our proposed expansion. Based on feedback from House and Senate leaders, this would appear to be a 2024 legislative issue.

**Energy Benchmarking and Other Anti-Business Ordinances** - Senate Bill 170, by Senator Jay Trumbull, that would significantly hamper any local ordinance that would create increased costs to businesses. This bill passed the Senate and is moving in the House. The House bill is waiting on a vote by the House.

**EV Charging Stations -** SB 1176 (Simon) and HB 1591 (Maggard) are legislation that would require the Public Service Commission to adopt rules for electric vehicle charging stations which meet certain requirements; provide a timeline for the proposal and adoption of such rules; and prohibit a public utility from using rate base investment for certain purposes. We are working with these sponsors to also seek preemptions to the state from local governments.

# **Summary of Week Four (March 27-31)**

#### **Budget Deep Dive**

The Florida House proposed a budget of \$113 billion (HB 5001), which is about \$700 million less than the Senate's proposed spending plan of \$113.7 billion (SB 2500). Both budgets fall short of the governor's recommendation of almost \$115 billion. Both the House and Senate proposals include pay raises for state workers, increased funding for infrastructure and land acquisition, more money for Florida KidCare, and full funding for Florida's Medicaid program. However, the House didn't allocate any funds for Visit Florida, the state's tourism agency, while the Senate earmarked \$80 million for it. Education is also a priority, with both chambers proposing to allocate over \$2 billion for it, which would result in a more than 4% increase per student. While the House has set aside \$250 million for teacher and school staff raises, the Senate provided \$200 million.

#### **Permitless Carry Headed to the Governor**

On Friday, the Florida Legislature passed a bill that will allow people to carry concealed weapons without the need for a state-issued permit. The bill has been passed by the Republican-controlled Legislature and is now awaiting approval from Governor Ron DeSantis. The bill was passed over the objections of Democratic lawmakers who argued that the loss of training required of permit holders would make the state more dangerous. However, Republican backers of the bill argued that dropping the permit requirement will make the state safer because law-abiding citizens will carry guns, and those who misuse guns do not follow the law anyway. Some gun rights activists did not support the bill, as it does not allow people to openly carry firearms. The right to bear arms, according to some Republican senators, is a "God-given right" that does not require permission from the state.

### Jury's In For Death Penalty Cases

The Florida Senate has approved a bill (SB 450) that would allow the death penalty to be imposed with the agreement of only eight out of 12 jurors, rather than requiring a unanimous agreement. The bill was introduced in response to the life sentence handed down to Nikolas Cruz, the shooter in the Parkland high school massacre of 2018, after only nine of the 12 jurors could agree on a death sentence. The bill sponsor, Republican Sen. Blaise Ingoglia, argued that the bill would prevent "activist jurors" from preventing a deserving defendant from being sentenced to death. The bill also requires the jury to unanimously find at least one aggravating factor was present in the crime before imposing the death penalty. If passed by the House, the bill would allow a judge to impose a life sentence without the possibility of parole even if the jury recommended the death penalty. The bill has the support of Gov. Ron DeSantis.

#### **Universal Vouchers Approved by Governor**

On Monday, Governor DeSantis signed HB 1, which allows each student, regardless of income, to receive up to \$8,000 for tuition to attend a school of their choice using the Family Empowerment Scholarship. Under the bill, eligible parents will receive an empowerment savings account to customize their child's K-12 education. The bill also increases the number of students with disabilities served under the Family Empowerment Scholarship by increasing scholarship growth rates from 1 percent to 3 percent of Florida's exceptional education students annually. The Senate has proposed \$2.2 billion to fund the program, including \$350 million in reserves in case additional families apply for the scholarship, and the House has set aside an extra \$110 million after analysts projected the expansion to cost \$210 million.

#### **Governor Signs Live Local Act**

On Wednesday, Governor DeSantis signed SB 102, the Live Local Act, that will invest \$711 million in affordable housing and offer tax breaks to incentivize developers to build more affordable options. The bill, which was passed with broad bipartisan support, will essentially double the amount the state put into affordable housing last year. It includes \$260 million for low-interest loans to developers who create certain types of affordable housing opportunities and more than \$250 million for local governments for housing programs. Additionally, \$100 million will go into the "Hometown Heroes" Program for down payment and closing cost assistance for first-time homebuyers in Florida who are employed in the state and for veterans and service members, among other provisions. However, some lawmakers and advocates for low-income renters have criticized the bill, saying it won't do enough to make rental properties affordable and that the state needs hundreds of thousands of affordable properties. Despite the criticism, supporters of the bill estimate that it could make thousands of apartments available at lower rents.

#### Hit the Snooze Button...On School Start Times

On Friday, the House approved a measure (HB 733) that aims to prevent middle schools from starting before 8 a.m. and high schools from starting earlier than 8:30 a.m. This proposal is based on research that shows teenagers need more sleep and early school start times can harm their learning abilities. California was the first state to require such start times, and Florida is following suit with this bill. The Senate also has a companion bill (SB 1112), which has not faced much opposition in the committee process. However, some local school districts have expressed concerns about compressed start times and providing transportation to students.
